



## Mother Mattie Mae Keyster

June 3, 1929 - April 19, 2016

Mother Mattie Keyster, 86, of Peoria, IL passed away at 2:24 pm on Tuesday, April 19, 2016 at Unity Point Proctor Hospital.

Mattie was born on June 3, 1929 in Lexington, MS to Drew and MaLiza (Travis) Johnson. She married Dillard Brown; he passed in 1964. She later married Fred Walter Keyster in 1968. He preceded her in death in 1999.

Mattie was a nurse's aid at Proctor Hospital for over 35 years, retiring in 1991. She was a faithful member of New Morning Star Missionary Baptist Church for over 59 years where she served 35 of those years singing in the choir. She also served on the Mother's Board and United Mission. Mattie not only loved her own children, she loved the children in the community serving as a foster grandmother with the Department of Aging.
