



## Mr. Barrymore Alan Moton

October 7, 1962 - March 7, 2025

Mr. Barrymore Alan Moton, 62, of Peoria, passed away on Friday, March 7, 2025 at PEERS Caring Homes for Veterans in Montgomery, Alabama.

Barrymore was born on October 7, 1962 in Peoria, IL, a son of McKinley and Barbara Annette (Moore) Moton, II.

Barrymore was a graduate of Peoria Manual High School, served in the United States Army, graduated from Illinois State University with a Bachelor's and Master's degree, he also received the "Ironman Award" from Illinois State University. He played professional football in the Canadian Football League (CFL). Barrymore was a member of Kappa Lambda Chi (KAX NI-ZO SMR 24 "War Machines") Veterans fraternity. He worked at Paradise Casino, the Children's Home and Juvenile Detention Center.

Barrymore was known for his Neo-Mache' Art sculptures, comprised from 100% recycled, archival paper derivatives. These priceless art pieces were created in the likenesses of NFL Hall of Famers such as Eddie Payton, Walter Payton, Deacon Jones, Lawrence (LT) Taylor and Fred Biletnikoff most of whom Barrymore met, had autographed and purchased his art pieces. He also created African art and sculpture pieces depicting ancestral figures from historical events.

Barrymore is survived by his sons; Barrymore Alan Moton and Braxton Ali Moton both of Peoria, IL; siblings; Alfred Darryl (Nancy) Moton of Pella, IA, Joe Douglas (Jackie) Moton of Dunlap, IL, Jay Emerson Moton of Houston Texas, his twin sister Barbara Annette (Robert) Moore of Peoria, IL, Jennifer Nadine (Michael) Farrell of Peoria, IL, Jimmie Lee Moton of Alexandria, VA, Timothy Moton of Chillicothe, IL; and numerous nieces and nephews, great nieces and nephews. He is preceded in death by his parents; his son, Mosa Moton; a brother, McKinley Moton, III and by a sister, Rose Lynn Moton.

Celebration of life will be at 11:00 o'clock a.m. on Friday, March 28, 2025 with the repast following, at Morning Glory Community Church in Peoria, with Pastor Marlon Young

officiating.
