



Ms. Gloria Jean Cassel Fitzgerald

August 16, 1948 - January 20, 2016

Gloria Jean Cassel Fitzgerald, 67, of Peoria, IL passed away peacefully at her home surrounded by family and friends at 7:55 PM on Wednesday, January 20, 2016.

Gloria was born on August 16, 1948 in Benton Harbor, Michigan to Alvie and Betty (Coates) Cassel. Early in her childhood, Gloria and family relocated to Peoria, IL. She received her education in the Peoria Public School System and graduated high school from the Academy of Our Lady Spalding Institute. Gloria went on to earn her Bachelor of Science degree from Bradley University in 1971. She received her Master of Arts degree also from Bradley in 1978.

Gloria's commitment to helping others led her to state service beginning with the Department of Public Aid in 1971. From there, she transferred to the Department of Children and Family Services in 1974 and was employed as a Social Worker. Due to Gloria's dedication to helping children she was soon promoted to supervisor and also won Supervisor of the year in 1982. She then served in a variety of increasingly responsible positions including supervising Social Worker/Team Supervisor. DCFS and the State of Illinois took notice of Gloria's leadership abilities and eventually relocated her to Chicago where she became the Site Administrator for the East Area Office of Cook County. She was then promoted to Associate Deputy Director for Operations and Community Services, then to Deputy Director for the Division of Education and Transition Services while in Chicago. Her love for education led her to the

University of Chicago where she received another Masters degree in Social Service Administration. In 2003, Gloria retired and returned to Peoria. Gloria not only loved working with children; but was active in the community. Gloria was a lifelong member of the Peoria Branch NAACP. She was a member of the Peoria Tri-County Urban League and the National Association of Black Social Workers. In her spare time, Gloria volunteered her services at George Washington Carver Center, the Peoria City Council and taught part time at Bradley University.

In her leisure time, Gloria enjoyed reading educational literature, collecting paintings and sculptures. She also enjoyed exploring the world. Her travels led her to visit Africa numerous times including South Africa, Egypt, Rome, France, Alaska and numerous Caribbean Islands.

One of her greatest accomplishments was her son, Kimani (Angelita Guevara), Fitzgerald; he survives. She is also survived by one brother, Dewayne Cassel of Hanna City, IL and one sister, Verma Harris of Peoria; one grandson, Brandon Gregory. Additionally, she is survived by her Aunt Catherine Coates and niece, Jessica Schulte; and a host of friends and the Peoria Community. She is preceded in death by her parents.

Funeral services will be held at 11 am on Friday, January 29, 2016 at Higher Dimensions Praise and Worship Church with a visitation beginning one hour prior at 10 am. Pastor R. W. Randle will officiate. Gloria will be entombed at Swan Lake Mausoleum. In lieu of flowers, memorials may be made to George Washington Carver Center or The Peoria Tri County Urban League.
