Mr. John C. Rodgers, Sr., 83 of Peoria, Illinois, transitioned to his heavenly home at 6:05 a.m. on Friday, January 12, 2024 at his babygirl's home.

He was born June 20, 1940 in New Albany, Mississippi to the late John Wesley Rodgers and Catherine (King) Rodgers. John accepted Christ at an early age and last served at his brother's church, Greater Bibleway Apostolic, under Pastor Earnest Rodgers.
