Ms. Mary LaVerne Hamilton, formerly of Peoria, IL, 90, departed this life at 2:08 am on Wednesday, June 4, 2025 at Antebellum Grove Senior Living in Warner Robins, GA.

Mary was born in Peoria, IL on August 11, 1934, the only child of William and Delores (Jones) Hamilton.

Growing up, Mary was always seen with her twin cousins Harry and Harold Proctor. She graduated from Peoria Central High School. Mary later went on to graduate from St. Francis Nursing School on September 5, 1956.
