Robert had a very active and amazing life. He formerly owned and operated B&R Shoe Shine Shops in Denver, CO at the Hilton and Marriott Hotels. The shoe company was a full service retail store offering shoes and accessories and shoe shines for men and women who dress for success. Robert began his career early. At the age of 8, he sold newspapers. He named Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and his vision as having had the greatest impact on his success. Robert's formula for success included having a vision, too, and he persistently pursued his vision. He enjoyed helping others become successful. His best asset was making resources work. Robert ran marathons for which he won many awards and was an avid photographer, bowler and golfer. He loved to travel and visited such places as Australia and New Zealand. He was also a creative wood artist/carpenter. Robert was a published author of two books, "Squirrel" and a Love Story. Robert was a past Mason. His family loved their dad and "Uncle Bob". He will truly be missed.
